

Linen Lace

MATERIALS

6 balls
Scheepjes
Linen Soft #629
27% linen 47% cotton
26% acrylic
135 m/ 50 gm
3 buttons
1 on the outside & 2
on the inside

NOTIONS

2 markers
Illustrated here to fit
a 6 year old using
approximately 700
metres

Length from Shoulder to Hem

38cm (15")

Half Fan British

1dtr, 3 ch, 1 dc back
into the top of the dtr
to form a picot] twice, 1
dtr in the same place.

USA

[tr, ch3, sc back into the
top of the tr to form a
picot] twice, 1 tr in the
same place.

Fan British

1dtr, 3 ch 1 dc back into
the top of the dtr to
form a picot] 4 times, 1
dtr in the same place.

USA

[tr, ch3, sc back into the
top of the tr to form a
picot] 4 times, 1 tr in the
same place.

This cardigan has a crossover back and lacy edge with makes it a gorgeous popover. It can be worn to a formal gathering or just with shorts.

88 chains

4 shells, CNR, 3 shells,
CNR, 4 shells, CNR, 3
shells, CNR, 4 shells

Work as the extended front
cardigan in the video until
the back reaches the magic
number.

Join the underarm. Work in
pattern until it is the
desired length ending with
an even row. Fasten off and
rejoin at the neck edge

Sleeve

Work 3 rounds with a
sleeve decrease, 8 rounds straight, 1 decrease round, 4 rounds straight, 1 decrease round. Work straight in pattern to the required sleeve length.

Edging

Attach yarn at the top neck edge work a half fan into the side of row 1, [1 dc(USA sc) in next 4 ch sp, fan in the next 4 ch sp] repeat down the back opening edge, [1 dc in the next 1 ch sp, fan into the next 1 ch sp] repeated across the bottom edge, [fan in the next 4 ch sp, 1 dc(USA sc) in next 4 ch sp,] repeat up the 2nd back opening edge,

Work 2 rows MM for neck edge working 5 ch buttonhole loop instead of the 2 ch at the beginning of the 2nd row of MM.

Sew 2 buttons on the inside of the neck to secure it and 1 feature button on the outside. Use 5 ch loop on the inside and the hole of the stitch to act as the 2nd button hole.



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
